CMS Australia is seeking to appoint a servant-hearted person to the role of **Regional Mission Director**.

The CMS Regional Mission Director (RMD) plays a vital role in the selection, deployment and pastoral care of CMS missionaries. They work with the International Director, Branch Directors, two other RMDs and CMS Australia staff to help enable CMS missionaries to serve long-term. The RMD is also involved in building and maintaining strong relationships between CMS and the international partner organisations and churches that CMS missionaries serve with.

Based in Sydney, the Regional Mission Director is required to travel for up to 10-12 weeks per year.

The position will commence in January 2023.

The successful applicant will have the following skills and experience:

- Strong interpersonal skills including ability to exercise initiative, work as part of a team and effectively delegate
- Prior long-term cross-cultural experience
- Active engagement in world mission
- At least one year of theological study
- Pastoral care skills and experience
- Sound cultural and emotional intelligence, and ability to make difficult decisions.

It is a requirement of this position that the incumbent will live and display a commitment to the Christian principles promoted by CMS-A and abide by the CMS Code of Conduct.
