
In North Africa there are few people who know about Jesus. There is currently one CMS missionary working in this area. She is teaching English and building relationships with people in her community.


ACTIVITY

- Your creativity!






STEPS:

- 1. Go outside to your backyard, a park or maybe even a bush walk and look for a smooth, flat rock. Try and find a few that's around the size of your palm. If they get too heavy, ask an adult to help you carry them.
- 2. Cover your work space so you don't get paint everywhere.
- 3. Wash your rocks to make sure that they're free of dirt.

 The cleaner they are, the easier it'll be to paint on them.
- 4. Choose any colour paint and start painting. Try and think of what things prehistoric people would have painted or come up with new ideas. Here are a few symbols you can copy to get started.


